New Zealand's bullying statistics show that what we're doing isn't working – bullying is going from bad to worse and we remain one of the worst countries in the OECD for bullying reported by students.

We need to change what we're doing.

New Zealand was in the bottom 7 for bullying out of 50 OECD countries<sup>2</sup>.

Others had improved leaving New Zealand in the bottom three<sup>3</sup>.

## DON'T LET OUR CHILDREN FEEL LIKE RUBBISH

Bullying has major consequences and some of these are lifelong. The impacts extend far beyond the victims of bullying too – there are consequences on the bullies themselves, for the bystanders who observe it taking place, and for the wider student group. Naturally, with such a wide impact on the children, teachers and the school are affected too.

## MAJOR IMPACTS OF BULLYING

- Missing days at school
- Can't engage and learn
- Achievement slips
- Feel anxious and withdrawn
- Lose self-esteem
- Don't feel safe
- Can't be themselves

### CONSEQUENCES FOR CHILDREN BEING BULLIED

- More likely to suffer from anxiety
- Twice as likely to suffer depression in later life
- Substance abuse
- Suicidal behaviour

## CONSEQUENCES FOR CHILDREN WHO HAVE BULLIED OTHERS

- An indicator of likely future delinquency
- Antisocial behaviour
- Psychosocial problems

Given the severity and the duration of the consequences for our children, we have a moral duty to do all we can to tackle this problem and make our schools a safer and happier place to be.



## WHY CHOOSE KIVa?


